### EMPLOYEES

- You have trouble keeping a good IT person on staff.
- You can't afford to have an IT person on staff, and depend on IT consultants when something goes wrong.
- You want your IT person or staff to focus on higher-priority tasks or more strategic initiatives.

### ACCESS

- You use independent contractors and external consultants and need to provide them with secure access to your systems on demand-but also to turn off access at a moment's notice.
